DP circulated the accounts for the 2013/14 season. A surplus £396 was recorded and he highlighted the donation of bulbs by our major sponsor, Bramcote Bulbs. As a result Bikini bulbs had been purchased with the main aim of encouraging exhibitors and this had in fact made a small profit.

DP felt that our healthy balance should be maintained as there was no guarantee our present income could be sustained. Accounts passed.

JP informed the meeting of impending changes to the hierarchy of the Daffodil Society Committee and there was an exchange of views regarding the revision of the Intermediate Listing with particular reference to North Somerset Show.

The experiment of a mid week AGM was reasonably successful. However, the meeting felt with the car park problems midweek we should revert to a weekend in future.

2014 RAFFLE/BULB AUCTION

Our thanks go out to members who once again dug deep at the AGM to support the only major funding raising of the Group. It is these proceeds that keep the Group on an even keel so to speak.

None of this would be possible but for the outstanding donation from our major sponsor Bramcote Bulbs with back up from Ron Scamp from Falmouth. The donations were so generous this year that we had to appeal for no member donations otherwise we would have been swamped.

There were some real classy bulbs on offer and a number of new introductions including Amber Valley, Qiyana Raine, Wichbold, and Seagrave from Bramcote and Sharon's Champagne from Ron Camp.

Jackie reported that 15 exhibitors attended Wessex Show on Sunday 13 April. One or two familiar faces sadly couldn't be with us, the early season once again doing Dorset no favours but we were very pleased to welcome new exhibitor, Jennifer Dean.

Despite the early season and a few of our regular exhibitors not attending we were pleased that the hall was respectably full and

colourful with some quality flowers to give our judges, Janine Doulton

and Richard Hilsom from the South East, some tough decisions. As usual the championship classes took all the guest judges' time and the remainder of the show was divided between the strong field of DS judges/exhibitors that we are fortunate to have in attendance. Many thanks.

It was great to see a strong and closely fought Wessex championship class with seven exhibitors and some very fine flowers. Our Chairman, Derek Philips won the 2014 Wessex championship class. Ivor Clarke's second placed entry, by the narrowest of margins, had both the Best Bloom and the reserve Best bloom within it and Evelyn Jane entry placed third contained the best Div 1 bloom, Disquiet .

Derek's USA flag was carefully fixed behind the ADS ribbon class as we set up and sure enough another USA ribbon was added to his collection. This man needs some serious competition - come on Jennifer Dean.

Not to be outdone Evelyn Jane received the DS bronze medal for a splendid 3x3 class. The Frank Calcraft class of for 6 Div 5-13 blooms went to Jackie Petherbridge with a cheeky exhibit of 6 miniatures. Jackie also won the miniature section which was well supported and a firm favourite with visitors.

Chris Yates deservedly won the silvered medal for most points picking up prizes across the divisions for his seedlings. Thanks to Angela and Alan for organising the raffle and to all those who contributed prizes.

Thanks also to Henton villagers for the bacon butties and refreshments and for visiting the show and making some very appreciative comments.
