- 1. All proceeds at Kempley go to St Edwards Church Fabric Fund & Kempley Village Hall Restoration Fund whilst at Oxenhall they go to the upkeep of St Anne's Church. For Dymock proceeds go to Dymock Parish Hall funds.
- 2. Parking, entry to all events & trips on the Daff and ride bus are all-free but donations are welcome.
- 3. Daffodil teas started in 1975 when four local ladies organised teas on a specific weekend to raise money for the local churches to coincide with the native daffodils that bloom in the local area.
- 4. The event is organised by local Committees in Kempley Oxenhall & Dymock and by the Countryside Restoration Trust with local people helping in various roles to provide a welcome to our visitors.
- 5. **Native Wild Daffodils The** small wild daffodils grow freely in many fields and the surrounding woods and can be enjoyed on the circular 'Daffodil way' footpath covering approximately eight miles. The daffodils may be seen from the roads between Newent, Oxenhall, Kempley and Dymock.
- 6. Local maps will be available from the village halls showing the sites of specific interest where daffodil fields can be seen. Several of the fields around Kempley are carpeted with daffodils and are designated areas of special scientific interest.
